Just past Winchester, turn right onto the Mountain Parkway, then continue to exit 22 (Stanton). Turn left at the end of the ramp, go under the parkway and follow the road (Hwy 213, Main St.) for about a mile and turn left onto Church Street. Stanton Christian Church will be on the right. The workshop will be in the gymnasium sized building behind the church. The program will begin promptly at 9 a.m.
